Description	Tunestalle or Tunstall is an unidentified place recorded in Domesday Book. It is mentioned in two entries. The first is with Stainsby, the second with Palterton and Scarcliffe. All these placenames place it around the Hardwick area and the VCH suggest that the place-name does appear on a map of the Hardwick Estate. [1] All the references to it place it after the other locations, and the entry for Palterton, Scarcliffe and Tunstall states it is a manor and berewick suggesting that possibly Tunstall is an outlier and may not be substantial.  Appears in the Gazetteer of Deserted Medieval Villages known in 1968.
